This letter is to confirm your report of the reception of KVAA. As you know, we operate on 910 KHz. One very unique fact is that we are one of the very few stations that <u>raise</u> our power at night from 500w (day) to 1000w (night)!

KV-91 went on the air May 4th, 1981, so you can see we are essentially a brand new radio station. We use a McMartin BA-1K transmitter, a Harris phasor and two towers during the day...three at night. The coverage map shown on this letter head is our daytime pattern.

Since we are such a new station, there is still quite a bit of construction to be completed, which explains why this reply to your letter was so long in comming. Please accept my appology. I do appreciate letters from DXer; and welcome future letters if you have any questions.
