I wish to thank you for your nice letter of Oct. 9. I am sorry that it has taken me so long to answ you but we have been very busy makinging some engineering changes and I just haven't had time to catch up on my correspondance. I very much appreciate the map you so thoughtfully enclosed with your letter. We made several copies of it for our manager and sales department and they found it very informative as to who we are competing with on this frequency. It is very plain that you are not in a very favorable direction from us so to receive us at all is quite unusual. A few years ago, we received several receiption reports from New Zealand and I am enclosing a copy of one of the reports. When you examine our coverage pattern, it is not too hard to see that under very favorable conditions they would be able to hear us OK. We only run lKW at night but due to the shape of our pattern we are actually putting out approximately 20KW ERP in the center of our major lobe.
