Dear Sir:

I had the pleasure of picking up the signal of your radio station on 1510 kilohertz nearly one year ago, January 21, 1978 at 5:44 p.m. Central Standard Time. Shortly thereafter, I mailed a report of my reception to the chief engineer, but have never received an answer. I am presently following up on some of my outstanding reports and decided to send this letter to you. The following is a summary of my reception during the above period.

5:44 Sign Off Announcement-"This concludes our broadcast day here at KMOO Radio. K M Double O is owned and operated by the AC Corporation operating at 1510 kilohertz with 500 watts power. Studios and transmitter are located just northwest of Mineola. We'll be at your service again tomorrow morning. Until then, have a good evening".

During your sign off announcement, your signal was readible, but there was interference from station K Y K R in Port Arthur who was also signing off. My receiver is a Hammarlund HQ-180AC and my antenna is a 2' Directional Altazmuth loop.

If you find this report to be correct and to your satisfaction, I would appreciate receiving a brief letter or card stating that my reception of K M O O is verified. I have 1,979 verifications, including 170 from the Lone Star State. Yours would be a most welcome addition to my collection. I have enclosed a stamp for your reply. Thank you very much for your time.
