Your report of reception of WHBL on the night of August 28th, 1962 was correct and you may consider this letter as QSL of reception.

At the present time we do not have a coverage map which we could send you. We are planning on increasing our power from 1000 W to 5000 W using a directional antenna. At the present time we are using a RCA BTA-1M transmitter running at 1 KW daytime and 250 watts at night. You received us while we were on 250 watts. We use a single tower antenna which is non-directional. The tower is 285 feet high and is a guyed type. Our transmitter bldg. is located south of Sheboygan and our studios are located in the Fountain Park Motor Inn.
