I received your signal report of March 10, 1975 and am most pleased to verify it and the program details you listed. We normally do not have any official QSL verification cards so I hope this letter will suit your needs.

Here's a bit more information about our organization for your records:

WOSH and our FM counterpart, WYTL form the Value Radio Corporation and are all part of the Midwest Family of Stations, the head station being WISM in Madison. WOSH is a kilowatt day and 250 watts at night. Skip conditions must have really been right that night when you picked us up. WOSH programs a top-40 music format and we take pride in being the clearest-sounding and most-listened to station in the Fox River Valley.

WYTL operates on 103.9MHz with a power of 3,000 watts in stereo. With an antenna height of 329 feet, the FM covers a radius of 45-50 miles and broadcasts country music.
