Dear Carl:

We are pleased to confirm your reported reception of WRIG in Overland Park, KS on April 9th, 1986. WRIG began operations as WSAU on 1370 KHz in 1937. The station later moved to 1400 KHz with 250 watts fulltime. In 1958 the station was sold and the call letters were changed to WRIG. A daytime power increase to 1000 watts was granted in 1961. In June of 1985 WRIG began transmission on 1390 KHz with 5000 watts day and night. The transmitter location is Southwest of Wausau, Wisconsin. Two towers are used for daytime operation and four towers in line with an orientation of 15 degrees are used for nighttime operations. Effective radiated power over the North pole into the Scandinavian countries is approximately 20 kilowatts. Since beginning operations on 1390 KHz WRIG has received many reception reports from Norway, Sweden and Finland.

Thank you very much for your report. We certainly enjoy hearing from distant locations.
