Dear Carl,

I am pleased to verify your reception report of this station on the morning of April 8th, 1963. We were conducting a frequency test with John L Beer, 1870 South Carr Street in Denver.

There is only one night a week that we can get in to him because of KDEN in Denver who also operates at 1340 kc.

We operate with a power of 250 watts full time with remote control equipment and studio in the Globe Hotel and our tower and transmitter about a half mile southeast of town. We are an affiliate of the Intermountain Network, which means we are primarily programmed by the American Broadcasting Company and the Mutual Broadcasting System.

All of the equipment we have here, with a few audio exceptions, is the old KOWB of Laramie, Wyo. When they went 5KW, they took the 250-watt equipment, from turntable to tower and established this station which they later sold to Larry Cobb, the stations manager and Bill Jones the county attorney.

I am surely sorry I can't send you a coverage map but we don't have any available. However I can tell you that our signal reaches as far as Scottsbluff in Nebraska and Laramie here in Wyoming. We have been picked up days in Ft. Collins, Colorado and on a freak skip one Sunday night our regular programming was picked up in Canada.

Thank you again, Carl, for the reception report. I keep a file of these reports to see just what our past skip has been.

In addition to your report we have had reports from
Minnesota, Texas and Canada.
