Dear Mr. Dabelstein,

Thank you for the reception reports dated June 18, 1989 and August 22, 1989. Your description of programming seems to match Q105's type of format.

Q105 operates in stereo on  $104.7 \mathrm{mHz}$  FM ( $100 \mathrm{kw}$ ) and on  $1380 \mathrm{kHz}$  AM ( $5 \mathrm{kw}$  day and night with directional antenna at night)  $24 \mathrm{-hours}$  7-days. We simulcast both stations except during special events.

WRBQ(AM) has had four sets of call letters since it signed on circa 1947: WTSP(AM), WLCY(AM), WNSI(AM), and WRBQ(AM). The transmitter site is located in St. Petersburg at 27.52'15" north latitude and 82.37'03" west longitude.

WRBQ-FM has also had four sets of call letters since it started circa 1950: WPKM(FM), WEZX(FM), WRBQ(FM), and WRBQ-FM. The transmitter site is located in downtown Tampa at 27.56'50" north latitude and 82.27'35" west longitude with a tower elevation of 605 feet.

Q105 is owned by Edens Broadcasting, Inc., a private communications company. We operate in 4 states with 9 radio stations.

I have enclosed a sample of our Q105 "SUPERSTICKER". You may lick the back and attach it to any clean, dry surface, but it may work better if you simply peel away the protective cover as it already has an adhesive backing.
