Dear Carl:

Since you recognized my name from my Lincoln, Nebraska days, the chief engineer gave me your letter for a reply.

I worked at KLMS-AM (1480 Khz) on-the-air in 1973-74. I then worked on an occasional fill-in basis all the way up through 1983, although I continued to voice commercials on an almost weekly basis for that entire period of time.

I am temporarily working at KSKG while I am in Central Kansas taking care of some personal business in my hometown.

KSKG (99-KG) operates on 99.9 Mhz, 24 hours a day. The transmitter is located several miles north a slightly east of Salina, Kansas. The transmitting antenna gives us an effective radiated power of 100,000 watts. The antenna utilizes circular polarization.

Incidentally, I recent caught Channel 3 television in the Fort Bragg, N.C. area on my television set at home (here in central Kansas). It was over-riding Channel 3 in Wichita, Kansas, so I turned the antenna toward the east, and there was the N. C. station's Noon News program. The best TV catch I ever got was a number of years ago, in the late afternoon, when I caught Channel 2 in Mexico City. I have confirmation of that one, in Spanish, yet. I also received KHJ-FM in L.A. here in Central Kansas about 17 years ago.

Thank you for recognizing my name. Best of luck to you in your endeavors in the Kansas City area.
