We thank you for your letter describing your reception of our FM signal in your area. The programming information you related in your letter is correct. We would be interested in hearing from you and other people in Omaha and the surrounding area as to what type of reception you are getting from our station KXCV and how often.

We have been on the air only since January 16, 1971. Some particulars of our station are: Complete Gates installation, using a 20H3 transmitter with 18 kilowatts output; a 12 bay circular polarized antenna, which has a gain of 6.6; and an effective radiated power of 100 kilowatts. Our stereo signal radiates from a 500-foot tower here on the campus of Northwest Missouri State College. Our studios are almost entirely staffed by students.

We always appreciate data concerning the signal of our FM station. This valuable information helps us to determine our actual transmission pattern in the area of our coverage. Please let us hear from you again.
