Mr. Dabelstein:

This is in reply to your letter of May 31st regarding reception of our FM signal on 99.3 MHz.

Your identification appears correct in every respect.

And I must say this is the first report of long-distance skip we've ever received since being on the air August 30, 1969. It is common to have skip (problems) from 100-200 miles with temperature inversions, etc., but most unusual for what you heard to occur.

On the AM side, we get frequent reports of our 980kHz being received.
