Dear Mr. Dabelstein:

We are pleased to acknowledge your letter of July 3 in which you report reception of our signal.

This is to confirm your verification of reception of CJUS-FM on 89.7 MHz at 6:59 p.m. Central Daylight Saving Time (5:59 p.m. in Saskatoon) on Tuesday, July 1, 1975. The information you reported in your letter matches with our log. For your information Canada converted to the Celsius method of reporting temperatures on April 1 last.

Here in Saskatoon, we also experienced the same phenomena. In my own case, I counted twenty stations that evening over a three hour period, most of which seemed to be located in Illinois, Iowa and Colorado. Some signal strengths were strong enough to give good stereo separtation.

Under separate cover, we are sending you a copy of the current issue of FOLIO published in Saskatoon. It contains our program listings, and program information which we trust you will find interesting.
