

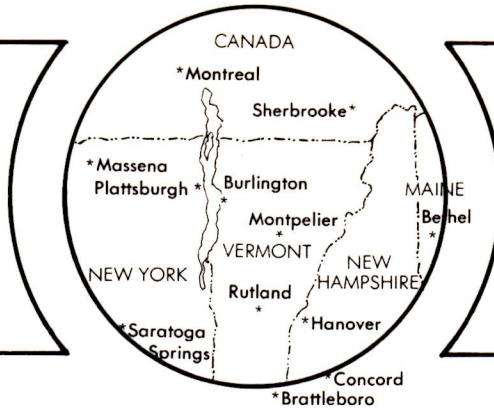

## Hughes Injured

Jeff Hughes of Burlington is out of the intensive care unit at the South Shore Hospital in South Weymouth, Mass. after slipping into a coma as a result of injuries sustained in an accident Saturday.

Hughes, who was a counselor at a football camp in East Brewster, Mass. had finished his duties there and while driving, swerved to avoid an oncoming car and hit a guard rail.

According to his father, Jeff was admitted to Cape Cod Hospital and released, but was rehospitalized due to effects of the injury later in the day.

There is a chance he may return to Burlington this weekend according to his father.

"He is lucky to be alive, the concussion was pretty bad," the elder Hughes said.

The injury will spoil a July 15 tryout date Hughes earned with the Cleveland Browns.

He apparently received an invitation to try out with the Browns through Milt Morin, Cleveland's tight end who was at the camp.

It is not known whether he will have an opportunity later in the summer.
