Dear Mr. Dangerfield:

Let this letter serve as verification that you received our broadcast on July 6, 1963.

WJVA is one of a chain of radio stations owned by the Booth Broadcasting Corporation in Detroit, Michigan. We are located in South Bend, Indiana about two miles southeast of Notre Dame University.

We have one tower 225 feet high and use a Collins 20-V transmitter. We operate on a daytime schedule but are on the air the first Friday of the every month at midnight for frequency checks and tests.

I could have verified your letter practically on the strength of the "interference" you mentioned from XEDM as every one who writes from your area tells me about it.

The children you heard are my 15 year old daughter and two young boys that are beginning DXers and they come out to help me and be disc jockeys for the night.

Sorry you had to wait so long for a reply but with the summer schedules plus an unususal amount of remote s this month, I am behind in my correspondence. Hope you catch us again. Iam enclosing a coverage map of WJVA.
