
Dear Sir,

Thank you very much for your letter of October 15th, and for the various details you include with regard to our transmission on 1052 kc/s. You are perfectly correct - 1052 kc/s (285.2 Metres) is the BBC's West of England Home Service, and is usually in operation from 0630 to approximately 2330 GMT daily. The programme details you give are in line with our programmes as broadcast.

You may be interested to know that a great deal of very long distance reception in the medium waveband is being reported at the moment, and this is usually associated with the Spring and Autumn seasons. Reports have recently been received of transmissions originating in Berlin which have been well received in various parts of New Zealand, even on as low power as 5 kilowatts.
