
Dear Sir,

Thank you for your interesting letter of the 27th March in which you report reception of the BBC Home Service on 692 kc/s. This, undoubtedly originated from our North Regional transmitter situated, as you rightly surmised at Moorside Edge. Two other transmitters radiate on this frequency but both are very low powered stations, designed for very local listening.

The programme details would appear to coincide with that radiated on the morning on 27th March in the Home Service.

The 1457 kc/s reception which you also report should have been the same programme although radiated by the West of England Home Service. This would probably be considerably weaker as the highest powered sender in this group of six stations is 20 kW only. This factor, of course, does not always apply with long distance propagation of medium frequency signals and with interference problems, the weaker stations may be reasonably well heard whilst more powerful radiations are practically obliterated.
