
Thank you for your letter of 14th January and your reports on reception of our medium wave broadcasts on 1546 and 881 kc/s.

We have checked the details of your reports with what we were broadcasting at the time, and it would appear that it was indeed one of our broadcasts that you heard.

Whilst we do not operate a QSL card service for our domestic broadcasts, we are always interested to hear from listeners abroad and we have forwarded your report to our Research Department. Thank you for your interest in writing.

With regard to the transmission of the Test Match which you heard, this is broadcast over the whole of the Third Programme network, so all medium wave transmitters in that network and all VHF ones would have been on the air. It is not unusual for us to broadcast important items such as this over the Third Programme network, the material on this occasion being a simultaneous rebroadcast of the ball-by-ball commentary which we receive from the Australian Broadcasting Commission's commentary on the spot.
