Dear Mr. Dangerfield,

Thank you for your letter of February 9 with
a reception report of November 7, 1964

It is correct that we have relay stations on
the mentioned frequencies, Akureyri at 737 kc/s
and Eidar at 665 kc/s. As to the hour you listened
and the programme details you give, these show that
it most likely was our station you heard. This
seems to be some kind of a miracle these stations
broadcasting only with the power of 5 kw. It very
seldom happens that we receive correct reception
reports from the U.S. If you succeed in picking
up these stations again, we should be very grateful
for a more detailed report as far as the programme
is concerned, so we can tell for sure that you heard
Iceland.
