Dear Kermit,


Thanks for the fine DX letter old man, and congratulations to you on both your excellent receiving equipment and your general system. Your log is correct in every detail, except that live announcements were made first and later played back from a transcription. This was done in order to get through to the receiving station measuring our frequency which is located in Long Beach, California. We've had extreme difficulty. If you hear us again, we'd appreciate another DX letter.

Our equipment is Western Electric, with a grid modulated 451-A transmitter, 1126-C limiter, and 25-B controls. Our antenna is an Allison Steel 153' guyed job.

In case you may be interested in dragging in more Arizona DX, KCNA in Tucson is going 5 KW in six weeks or so on 580 KC. They're now 250 on 1340. Don't know what their pattern will be, but you might keep an ear out for them.
