
Dear Mr. Geary,

Thank you for your letter and tape reporting reception of our medium wave transmission on 844 KHz for the evening of the 6th of December. After listening to your tape I am pleased to confirm that you were in fact tuned to VSZ1. The clearest part of your tape, cut 3, was in fact one of our producers, Atiera, giving a report of the proceedings of our Legislative Council meetings, which were held at the begining of December.

The power output of our transmitter is 10KW radiating omnidirectionally from a three wire T. aerial 250 ft long on 180 ft masts.

We have now received several reports of reception in from the East coast of the United States. I am not quite sure whether this is an indication that we are operating efficiently or not. Anyway thanks for the report.
