Dear Mr. Geary:

Many thanks for you letter regarding the reception of our signals on Dec. 4th. I am sorry to be late in replying, however this time of the year finds our entire staff quite busy.

We have received quite a few reports from various parts of the nation ... so, apparantly, our skywave has become rather good during the past few weeks.

Our equipment is entirely composit ... the transmitter sight is approximately $l\frac{1}{2}$ miles north of Visalia near an old river bed. The tower is constructed from steel pipe ... is guyed and is 170 feet high.

Visalia itself is a community of 12,000 in the city-limits but serves a surrounding population of another ten thousand. We are in the middle of the state ... about 40 miles South-East of Fresno.

Our regular frequency checking period is from 1:15 to 1:30 am on the fourth Monday of each month. PST, of course. Perhaps you can listen for us then.
