Dear Mr. Geary,

Thank you for your fine report of reception of K S UE on the morning of February 13th. Your report was very complete, and we were glad to know that you were able to hear us so well. It must have been a good morning for DXing, as we also received a report from Reading, Penn., and one from Madison, Wis., for the same date.

This letter will verify your report of reception. KSUE carrier was on starting at 1:30 AM P.S.T., however, so it must have been some other station coming through at 1:20. Our carrier was on from 1:30 to 1:45 AM P.J.T. for a frequency check. Carrier was modulated with band music between announcements of call and location. Our regular Frequency check time is 1:15 to 1:30 AM, on the second Friday morning of each month. However, currently we are operating without a Frequency Monitor, and must have a check each week, 1:30 to 1:45 AM.

We are aperating with a composite transmitter working into a 150 Ft. Wincharger tower. Our location in Northeastern California is 4195 ft. elev., on the Eastern slope of the Sierra Nevada Range.
