Dear Kermit:

Thank you for your reception report and kind wishes about WNVR.

This letter will serve as a verification that you received WNVR, 1380 kHz, between 5:02 and 5:17 p.m. EST, on Monday, December 3, 1979. We were operating at 500 watts on night pattern at the time of your reception.

Kermit, what amazes us is that you are located in our deepest null! We orient our nighttime signal to the northeast, east-southeast.

Unfortunately, we do not have any QSL cards at present. I am enclosing a copy of our daytime coverage map. While the map looks like we have a non-directional signal, believe me, we don't. This coverage map was drawn from data compiled by our consulting engineers.

Thanks, again, for your report. We look forward to hearing from you again.
