0800 " News

0810 " Programme Parade

We think, therefore, that it was most likely our London Home Service that you heard on the morning of January 26th.

During the past winter we have received quite a number of letters reporting on reception of our domestic services in North America and, similarly, American medium wave stations have been heard quite frequently in this country.
