Thank you very much for your reception report dated 17th inst., regarding our transmission on 1366 k/cs from here in Germany. We transmit on this frequency with a power of 15 KW originating from our station at Herford.

In addition to this we transmit on 1095 k/cs (274 metres) on the following stations and powers as shown:

Langenberg (Ruhr) 1095 k/cs(274 metres) 20 KW
Hannever " " (" " ) 20 KW
Pinneberg (Hamburg) " " (" " ) 20 KW
Berlin " " (" " ) 5 KW

It is interesting to note that yours is the fourth reception report we have received from State Side during the last month, and it appears that during this period, conditions in the ionosphere have been ideal for such reception. The previous three reports were from:
