With great pleasure we have today recieved your reception report and do verify in every respect.I have forwarded same to the office of the chief engineer for his attention;


We were allgreatly surprised to learn of reception of our signal in good Pa.A great deal of talk has been raised among the engineering staff both American and Itatian.

I am a Pennsylvanian and an old time ham W8QEP. Pittsburgh was the last town in which I lived and operated.
