General Information.

Programmes are broadcast on the following wavelengths:-

Athlone 530 metres, 566 Kcs.

Dublin) 240 " 1250 Kcs.
Cork)

Athlone is the only Station likely to be received outside Ireland - having a strength of 100 Kws. The broadcasts from Dublin and Cork are made on low-powered transmitters (2 K/W) for local reception.

Regular broadcasting hours are: 8.00 to 9.15, 13.00 to 14.30, and 17.30 to 23.30. News Bulletins are broadcast at 8.00, 9.00, 13.30 and 18.30 (in the English language), 22.00 (in the Irish language) and 22.15 (in English). All these times are local Irish time. This corresponds with Greenwich Mean Time except from April to October when it is one hour ahead of Greenwich Mean Time.

High Mass is broadcast at 10.30 hours each Sunday morning and special Retreats are broadcast during Lent and Advent.

Orchestral Concerts are given by the Radio Éireann Symphony Orchestra before an invited audience, at the Phoenix Hall, Exchequer Street, Dublin, on each Tuesday and Friday at 20.00 hours. These concerts are broadcast.

Radio Éireann does not at present publish a Journal, but programmes are published in fairly good detail in the following weekly publications:-
