0700 GMT	News	
0710 GMT	Programme	Parade
0715-0750 GMT	Programme	of Light Music.

It was therefore most likely this service which you heard on the morning of December 26th.

We are now receiving a large number of reports of reception of our medium wave transmissions in North America, and similarly American medium wave transmissions are quite frequenctly received here during the hours of darkness.
