It is certainly a pleasure receiving asreception report as neat and detailed as yours. Almost thought is was a resume at first.

Please consider this letter as verification of the program material you listed as being heard. QSL cards are at the printers, so hang tight.

We have found from previous reports that most of the Pennsylvania listening area is relatively free from atmospheric interference, and very little interference from XEDM. As indicated in your report, your area is no exception. Maryland however is someting else altogether. A report from the Baltimore area indicated S-7 to S-9 on WJVA, with an occasional rise to 10 over S-9. Interference from noise gave a S-5 to S-8 reading with XEDM fading in and out heavily from S-5 to 20 over S-9. Same test. Same night. Two reports from Alden, N.Y., Jerry Monroe and Josh Hill, indicated about midway between you and the report from Maryland. Isn't radio fun?!?!
