We were on the air to do our yearly proof of performance measurements. We had just installed our NEW Harris MW-5 5,000 watt transmitter. Up until recently WFSR was broadcasting with 1,000 watts.

I'm very pleased to know our signal was coming into Walnutport as good as you reported.


Sounds like you have a reciever that you can be very proud of. I was once into DXing myself, but had to give it up because of the pressures of my job.
