Thank you very much for your report and letter of January 22nd, advising of your reception of WIPA (formerly WASL). WIPA operates under its license from local sunrise to local sunset. Our present broadcast day for the month of February is from 7.00 A.M. E.S.T. to 5.45 pm.

WIPA (originally WASL) was the first station in Annapolis, going on the air December 21, 1946, at 2.00 PM. We operate with 250 watts, using Collins transmitter, Type 300-G. Antenna is 267 feet - 4 post tower end fed. R.C.A. speech equipment.

We appreciate your letter and interest, and hope that the above is satisfactory. If there is any other information that you desire, please do not hesitate to let us know.
