Date and time of broadcast confirmed is July 26, 1948 from 2:24 A to 3:00 A CST. The weather here was clear and warm. We use Collins equipment with a pair of 810's in parallel in the finals.

If you will drop a line to Mrs. H. A. Frantz, who is my mother, at Coplay, Pa., and advise her that you picked us up, I will certainly appreciate it as a personal favor. I may be able to give her advance notice on some future equipment checks, and I know that she'll be glad to relay the information to you if you're interested in trying to get us again.
