Thank you for your most interesting letter reporting reception of WCNC on the morning of November 23. The report you submitted checkes with our log.

We are using Western Electric equipment, 310B transmitter, 23B speech console, saitshaker microphones, and RCA turntables. The antenna is a Blaw-Knox, onehundred seventy-five foot vertical.

The transmitter of WCNC is located about one mile from down town Elizabeth City on the outskirts of Disimal Swamp, and about twenty miles from the Atlantic seacoast. Elizabeth City has appopulation of approximately fifteen thousand, located in the extreme northeastern part of the state, about thirty miles from the Virginia line, fifty miles from Norfolk, Virginia, our mearest large town. Approximately seventy miles South of the City is located Roanoke, Island, where the Lost Colony was founded and the forst white settlement in America. It was here that Virginia Dare was born.
