First I would like to say thanks a million for your nice letter, I'm gald to hear that we are putting in a nice signal up there Ionly wish it could be a permanent one.

We were on the air Sunday Jan. 9th 1949, from 4:40 A.M. until 4:50 A.M. for our monthly frequency check. The station was signed on and followed by tone modulation (1000 cycles) for a duration of ten minutes the tone was on for 30 sec. and off for 10 sec.

Although I was not employed here at the time of the equipment checks a check with the back transmitter logs and a talk with announcer that was on duty at the time, shows that the station was on the air at 2:07 on the morning of february 12, 1948. The reason for being on at that time was for Freq. Check and Equipment Tests.

Taanks again for your fine letter and let me wish you much more fine listning. I am .
