

This will acknowledge your letter of recent date, and will confirm your report of reception of our long wave, CHNS, operating on a frequency of 960 kc., Tuesday, October 10, 1950, 7.04 to 7.15 a.m. ADT., and Wednesday, October 11th, 1950,  $6.59\frac{1}{2}$  to 7.14 a.m. ADT.

For your information CHNS is on the air Monday through Saturday, 7.00 a.m. to 12.15 p.m. ADT., and Sunday 9.00 a.m. to 12.15 p.m. ADT. By the end of October we will revert to Standard Time, running between the hours quoted above.

You may also be interested in knowing that our shortwave, CHNX, operating on a frequency of 6130 kc., carries the full schedule of the long wave CHNS.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your interest in the Station, and to compliment you on the excellent report you submitted.
