To give you a little technical background of our station, we do operate on 1280 KC with output power of one KW. Our transmitter is a Collins 20V. It uses two 4400-A's in the final. We have a one tower, non directional output. Our transmitter is located 3.2 miles South-east of Jackson, with the studios and control point in Jackson. We appreciate your statement that the quality of voice and music was good, especially since we are remoted so fat and with about half of that being on open lines. Actually our audio response is very good considering those open lines.
