Dear Mr. Geary:

Many thanks for your report on the reception of our station.

CJRH, located in Richmond Hill, Ontario, first broadcast on the assigned frequency of 1300 kcs. on July 1st, 1957, with a limited broadcast schedule from sunrise to sunset and used an omnidirection radiation pattern.

On March 20th, 1959 we began broadcasting twenty-four hours a day with a power output of 1,000 watts on a daytime pattern and 250 watts output on the night time pattern, on the assigned frequency of 1310 kcs.

On October 13th, 1961, we were granted a further power increase to 10,000 watts daytime, 2,500 watts night time. At this time we also changed our call letters to CFGM.

We appreciate reports from listening posts such as yours and wish you continued success in the field of service. 73's and DX.
