Dear Friend:

We were indeed pleased to receive your interesting report of our station, HJCB, 1105 kilocycles, and after checking your schedule against our log we have foung it to be absolutely correct.

In your letter you mention that in March of this year you sent in another report of reception, but received no answer. Unfortunately, this letter must have been lost in the mail, because we have no previous correspondence from you in our files.

With regard to our QSL, we are sorry to inform you that we do not have any QSL cards made up with our present call letters, due to the fact that the Communications Commission has not standardized on any definite code for the country, and the letters which are at present assigned to us may be changed any day. Nevertheless, we are sending you our old card, with our original "HJ3ABD" call as acknowledgement of your present report, You will be surprised to know that we are using only two kilowatts, but in the next few months we are increasing to five kilowatts.

Our short wave station, HJCD, 6,160 kc., on the 49 meter band, transmits the same programs as our standard wave station, HJCB, In view of the excellent report that you send in, we hope that you will be able to give us a check up on the short wave station, perhaps checking over a period of several days. The station is on the air from 10:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M., and from 4:30 P.M. to 11:00 P.M., E.S.T. Sundays, from 10:00 A.M. straight thru to 10:00 P.M. E.S.T.

It is very gratifying to receive your report of such splendid reception, and we wish to thank you again for your interest, and also for the picture of lehigh Gap.
