My apologies for the delay in responding to your recent letter concerning your reception of our station in Pennsylvania. The station is preparing for its FCC License Renewal Application and it has been quite busy recently.

From the description of the programming you heard on the morning of April 14, it was indeed Lite 102 you heard. We have changed the call letters and programming to a 100% simulcast operation with WJLT-FM. That became effective February 1, 1988. Also, Joe Beail, who was station manager for the past 12 years, moved on to a similar position at WKEU in Griffin, GA on February 1 as well.

It is quite interesting that our station can be heard clearly from some 260 miles away. It sounds like you have a keen ear for distant stations. I would be interested in knowing what other stations you hear from your "listening post."
