Dear Mr. Geary,

I am writing in response to your letter of June 6, regarding reception of KCCK-FM. After some checking with our person in charge of the log that afternoon, I found that the information you supplied me was correct, and you were indeed receiving KCCK-FM at 88.3 mhz.

It's interesting, the time of day which you received our signal. During that time we are rebroadcasting a program originating at WOI-FM in Ames, Iowa. From Ames, the signal is picked up and rebroadcast by KHKE-FM in Cedar Falls, Iowa, which originates the signal which we eventually rebroadcast. We are the third and final link on this mini-network so to speak, which provides simultaneous classical music programming about five hours each weekday, and four hours on weekends.

Our effective radiated power is 10,000 watts, from a 400-foot tower. Our signal more than adequately covers the seven-county area which our community college serves. We went on the air with 10,000 watts on July 1, 1975. Previously, the station was only 10 watts.

Thank you for informing us of your reception of KCCK-FM. I'll be sending you a current program guide to give you some more background and information on the station, and also for any future listening.
