Dear Kermit,

Your report of reception of this FM broadcast station comes to us as quite a surprise. Your report of our programming is correct. You did hear us.

Considering the antenna you were using and the supput of our transmitter makes it more surprising.

We are one of the smaller FM stations with 3000 watts effective radiated power both herizontal and vertical. Our antenna is a Gates Radio Company four-bay circular xxxxxx radiation fed by a Gates Radio Company 2000 watt transmitter tuned down to about 1650 output to the transmission line. The antenna radiation center is about 155 feet above average terrain. It is side mounted at the top of our 172' AM tower.

Incidentally, on the following Saturday afternoon after the day of your report, that is on the 8th, an FM station in your state was heard here. My general manager was driving north of Chanute and was less than 10 miles away when the Pennsylvania station came in for several minutes and completely eliminated our station on his car FM receiver. He did not catch the station or city but did kara hear them say semething about being in Pa. That's a real fluke for you since our signal strentgh was so high where he heard them.
