Thank you so very much for your kind letter regarding your receiving our station in Walnutport, Pa. It came as a pleasant surprise...interesting what happens with skip at times.

Our station operates at 3,000 watts ERP and the antennae height is 140 ft. above average terrain. This makes your reception even more remarkable! Congratulations. As you pointed out, it is even more amazing since WHYY broadcasts on the same signal (90.9 mHz) with 13,500 watts only 60 miles from you.

I have enclosed a copy of our log sheet with the time you mentioned. The live weather is the one we receive from the LA. Weather Network via phone lines from Bill Sturtevant. The song ("Ain't Nothin' Better" text) to which you referred was "Miracles" by Jefferson Starship. I also sent cover page for daily log and brochure on our station. Hope this is of help to you and that you are able to get us again sometime.

I am going to try to get this covered in the local paper if possible...something like KSLU SENDS SIGNAL FROM LA TO PA. If it get in the paper I will be sure to send you a copy.
