We were delighted and surprised to receive your letter dated June 27, concerning our broadcast on June the 26th. Delighted as all station personnel are when their listeners write regarding their programs, and astonished at the news that we had been heard at a distance of 150 air miles. We checked through our program logs and find that you are absolutely right. You certainly took careful note of what was done on that day.

You may be interested to know that we have been operating on 30,150 watts for about one month using a new R.C.A. BTF-5E and a six bay R.C.A. BFA-6B antenna on a tower 127 feet above ground level which is about 334 feet above mean sea level. WGTS is an educational FM station operated by voluntary student labor under the Department of Speech of Columbia Union College. During the college year we operate between the hours of 4 p.m. in the afternoon to 10:30 p.m. in the evening, on weekends and Sundays and from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Saturdays. Our frequency, as you reported, is 91.9 megacycles. You are to be congratulated on your precise receiver. We trust that you will drop us a line again concerning your reception of WGTS-FM and many thanks for your good wishes for our operation.
