This is to confirm your report of reception of WJHU, Baltimore on Tuesday, June 21, 1994 between the hours of 0645 and 0716.

WJHU, Baltimore Public Radio, broadcasts National Public Radio's "Morning Edition" news program every weekday from 0600 until 0859. Our local anchor is Tom Olson, with traffic reporting by Lisa Callahan.

WJHU operates 24 hours a day at an Effective Radiated Power of 10,000 Watts at a frequency of 88.1 MHz. We are licensed to the Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, Maryland. Our programming includes classical music, jazz, public affairs call-in shows and news from National Public Radio, our affiliated network. The transmitter is located on TV hill here in Baltimore. The tower height is 115.9 meters, while WJHU's 3-bay Jambro antenna is at 101 Meters.

WJHU is supported by listener contributions as well as local businesses and foundation grants, which are usually program-specific.
