Dear Sir:

This letter is to confirm your reception of WJWR on Sunday, June 19th. The information you have supplied us with is correct.

Sorry for the hand written letter but all the typewriters are in use at the present. Hope you will be able to understand this.

In answer to your questions: first WJWR is on the air every day from 9 am to 9 pm. Our antenna is one hundred and fifty feet above ground and we are located in a valley. The actual height above average terrain is seventy feet. Our transmitter is a Gates 250 watt feeding into an Andrews 4 bay antenna giving us a gain effectively of 3.7. We have loss in our transmission line so we arrive at about 800 watts effective radiated power.

Would appreciate a report after you get an antenna up.
