Dear Mr. Geary:

This will confirm your report of reception of WRAK-FM from 11:46 PM to Midnite, September 25, 1961.

WRAK-FM is located in Armstrong Twp. on Bald-eagle mountain range, about 4 miles south of Williamsport. The Ant. is approx. 1280 feet above average terrain and 2100' above sea level.

The equipment consists of an RCA BTF-10C transmitter feeding a four section Pylon on top of a 200' tower. At the present time we are running the transmitter at 10KW with a gain in the pylon of six. Deducting the loss in transmission line we have approx. 53 kw. ERP.

To date , we have not run any field strength measurements to determine our coverage. The reports such as yours, Mr. Geary, give us some idea of what to expect in the future when we make these tests. One of the things I was particularly interested in was the New York and Baltimore stations on the same channel, of which you mentioned and give me a good idea of what to expect.

In the future, we plan to program FM separate from the AM by using Hi-Fi tape system. Plus news, sports, etc. We hope you will continue to be one of our listeners and thank you very much for the very fine report.
