Thank you for taking the time to let us know of your reception of Sunny. Your log of program items is quite accurate. This letter is confirmation that you did indeed recieve WSNI-FM on November 26, 1977 on it's assigned frequency of 104.5 mHz. Yours is the first reception report we have recieved since we signed on the air with a new format and transmitter. Our transmitter is located on Domino lane in Roxborough, Pa. The WSNI transmitter is currently operating at a reduced output of 3500 watts with an E.R.P. of 1.2Kw. Our antenna is mounted 1190 feet above ground on the Channel 17 (WTAF-TV PHILA.) tower. We expect to be granted permission by the FCC, within 60 days, to operate at our licensed ERP of 17.5Kw. We will be the first facility ever to operate on a triplex antenna system with two other Phila. stations. They are WMGK-FM and WDVR-FM. At present we are operating on a permit allowing us to use the antenna by bypassing the triplexer and feeding the antenna direct. Any reception report you may care to send at a later date will be most apprecieted. WSNI is a licensee of Rust Craft Broadcasting of Penna. Inc. A subsidiary of Rust Craft Corporation, whos main concern is printing and the greeting card buisness.
