Thanks very much for your letter of May 7 and reception report of WRNL-FM. This was indeed an unusual reception report in view of the distance and type of equipment you were using. I was surprised to hear you were receiving this signal with no antenna. We have compared your reception report with our program schedule and find that it is accurate and would like for you to consider this letter your verification of reception on May 7, 1960, from 6:00-6:12 AM EST of WRNL-FM.

We were using a Western Electric 10 thousand watt transmitter operating into an RCA Antenna, which gives us an effective radiated power of 50 thousand watts.

I trust you enjoyed listening to WRNL and that you will try to listen often in the future.
