I am most embarrassed to realize that your nice letter of August 26 did not receive the prompt reply which we try to give all our correspondence. The reason for this delay was probably due to my desire to give your letter the more than usual time for correspondence.

We are pleased to confirm your report of reception of WRVA-FM from 10:14 to 11:15 P.M., EST, on Thursday, August 25, 1960. This was an excellent report.

We appreciate your report and hope that you may listen to us frequently. This station broadcasts on a 24-hour daily schedule with a power of 50,000 watts on a frequency of 1140 kilocycles. Our FM antenna is 500 feet high and our power output is 25 kilowatts.
