Thank you for your letter of the 17th, to our chief engineer, reporting on reception of our FM signal there. He has asked that I reply to you.

Yes, your report is easily confirmed. We enjoyed reading your very nice, detailed letter.

You may be interested to know that we broadcast from a tower 406 feet in height and our heighth above sea level is about 500 feet. Our FM e.r.p. is 14,000 watts. We have an RCA transmitter and our "old-fashioned" two-bay "smokestack" pylon is mounted at the top of our AM tower.

We have been on the air since April, 1947 and began FM broadcasting in 1949. We frequently get reports of AM reception from eastern Pennsylvania and New Jersey and Connecticut, so possibly you may get our AM signal on 800 kilocycles if you search for it. We broadcast on 5,000 watts AM power. I guess you might experience considerable interference on AM from WCHA, Chambersburg.

Thanks again for your fine letter. If you are ever in this area, we would be happy to have you drop by and visit us.
